Other Admin Matters...

Visa

International visitors to the Democratic Republic of Nepal must carry a valid passport. Citizens of most countries are able to get a Visa On Arrival at Tribhuvan International Airport to enter into Nepal. However, citizens from certain countries are not able to get Visa On Arrival. In addition, each participant is responsible for applying for and obtaining a visa at the nearest Embassy or Consulate of the Democratic Republic of Nepal or at the International Airport. Food & Transport

The Organizing Committee will set up a counter at the Nepal Tribhuvan International Airport to assist participants to take taxis or public transport to the hotel for registration upon their arrival.

We apologize for not being able to provide transportation service for participants who arrive in Nepal by other means.

Chartered buses will be available for the relevant sessions.
